The Space Station Explorers Student and Educator Spotlight blog features posts by students and educators who have sent experiments to space or participated in Space Station Explorers programs.

Please include the following when submitting a blog post:

1. Release form filled and signed (by parent or guardian if student is under 18)
2. One or more photo
3. Captions for photos
4. Short bio about the student or educator
For example: “[Student Name] is in [Grade Level] at [School Name] in [City Name]. She participated in [Program Name] in 2019 and saw her project launch to the ISS on [Resupply Mission Name e.g. SpaceX CRS-18] in [Date e.g. June 2018]. She likes [list subjects and/or hobbies e.g. surfing, rock collecting, drawing, and dogs]. One day she hopes to be [Career Name].”
5. Title of post
6. Body of post (about 500 words**). Here are some sample questions to get you started:
 - What project are you involved in?
 - How did you choose the topic you investigated?
 - How could this type of research be useful for humankind?
 - What did you do to get your experiment ready? (For example, did you divide up tasks with other team members? Did you get help from scientists or mentors? Did you learn a programming language? Did you have to do anything special to meet NASA’s payload safety requirements?)
 - If you’ve had a chance to review your data, what were the outcomes of your experiment? Did you find anything surprising or exciting?
 - How has this experience affected your thoughts about the directions you want to take in school or in a career?
 - If you could do a follow-up experiment, what might it be?
7. Blog posts you contribute must be original content that has not already been published somewhere else.



Appearance and Materials Release
